St. Columbkille. (Dunaleo on the bank of the

lough in the townland of Ardoley, about 3  
miles west of Drogheda. This well is visited  
by a large number of people throughout  
the year, but generally in the month  
of September. There is no annual pilgrimage  
day. Dues to be paid for anything  
which the pilgrim may request. The pilgrimage  
is performed by kneeling at well & saying

Fox's: says for Casa CURRENANEELLEN  
situated on the bank of Great River in  
the town lands of Vila de Aguiar, 4 miles  
west of Newport.

For distance on the bank of C. River,  
Cabeceiras distance, about 6 miles west  
of Newport. This goes to Casa Cabeceiras.

Three Column Hill (Sic) 7 feet, and 7  
aves, the tree walks round well 7  
times (day in each time) País and 1  
ave. He then kneels on knee again &  
says 7 País and 7 aves. This service  
is repeated on three days, the correct  
days being Monday, Wednesday, Friday.  
When pilgrim has completed on his  
Monday he goes across the town  
and says any prayers written at  
Dore mentioned on Page vii under "Old  
Patrician Church". Well preserved by Galloway.
