Allergan Official Opening – Biologics 2 Plant – 28:01:2020

January 29th saw the opening of Allergan's Biologics2 €160m facility in Westport, creating 63 additional jobs, bringing the firm's total investment in Ireland to more than €750m and underpinning the firm's commitment to County Mayo. The new state of the art manufacturing suites and laboratories will meet growing global demand for flagship products and increase research and development capabilities.

Housing

Progress on 2016-2021 programme is as follows:

- 415 units have been completed with another 282 in different stages of progress.

HAP and RAS - In January 2020 the following was delivered: -

- 25 houses delivered under the HAP scheme
- 1 house delivered under the RAS scheme
- This gives a total of 2,328 households supported by RAS and HAP in Mayo.
- Leasing - In January 2020 7 houses delivered.
- Refugee Resettlement - 167 persons accommodated in Mayo to date (151 Mayo County Council and 16 persons accommodated by the Red Cross in pledged accommodation)

Homelessness

- There were 12 presentations in January 2020.

Roads

- Contractor mobilising for N5 Westport – Turlough scheme.
- N26 Cloongullane Re-alignment Scheme tender documents will be issued to qualified contractors before end of February with a contract award expected by the end of May.
- Works continuing on the N59 Kilmeena scheme.
- Design works ongoing for the N60 Manulla scheme with submission to An Bord Pleanála for approval to take place in Q1 2020. Public consultation day held in Manulla on 28th January.
- Works on-going to the R312 Glenisland scheme.

- Prepare Your Business for Customs Workshop took place in Breaffy House Hotel on 28th January in preparation for Brexit on 31st January
- Mayo LAG in partnership with LEO Mayo has procured consultants to conduct an audit of the food and drink sector in Mayo with the aim of developing a strategic plan for the sector to 2025.

Community Engagement

- LEADER - 11 projects including 2 food projects to the value of €410K were approved by the LAG in January.
- The LCDC launched new grant scheme for community-based initiatives to promote positive mental health.

Mayo Sports Partnership

- Sport Ireland announced 2020 core funding of €282K for Mayo Sports Partnership a 6% increase on 2019
- Get Active Mayo programmes relaunched Men on the Move (11 locations), Couch25K (5 locations), Walking Groups (17 locations), Swim for a Mile (3 locations), parkruns (5 locations) and junior parkruns (2 locations)
