ALI DAVEY researched 19th century decorative architectural ironwork in Dublin, for her Masters thesis in Urban and Building Conservation at UCD. She joined Historic Environment Scotland (HES) as a Research Fellow in 2006, researching architectural ironwork made and found in Scotland. She has written the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht Advice Series publication on the care of architectural ironwork, and the HES Short Guide on the care of architectural cast ironwork.
