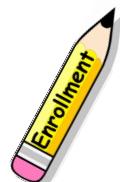

**Next Wednesday 17th February is Ash Wednesday the beginning of Lent.**

This year I am not in a position to distribute ashes on your forehead, so instead I invite you to please take home some Palm Crosses which I have blessed, for each member of your family household. Please let them be a focus of you praying, fasting and giving during our preparation for Easter.

You can also bring home a Trocaire box for your family for your Lenten offerings which can be returned on Holy Week.

*As Catholics we are asked to abstain from meat and to fast on two days in the year, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means that one full meatless meal can be eaten in the day. Two other meatless meals may be taken to maintain strength but together they should not exceed one full meal. Liquids, including milk and fruit juice, may be taken between meals. The fasting regulation applies to all Catholics aged 18 to 59 while those aged fourteen and above are asked to abstain from meat. Some people are not required to fast; these include those who are sick, pregnant or nursing women and manual labourers according to need. In the past, Irish Catholics were required to abstain from meat every Friday. While still not a requirement, the Irish Bishops' Conference has suggested it as a form of Friday Penance during Lent.*
