



ADVENT STARTS THIS WEEK: *the Advent Wreath* is a circle of evergreens. The circular shape symbolises the eternal nature of God. The evergreens - the continuing & everlasting life that comes from God through Christ. The 4 Candles (3 purple & 1 pink) mark the 4 weeks of Advent. Purple for Repentance and Pink for Joy (Gaudete). A white candle is placed in the centre on Christmas Eve.
